April and May minutes were approved with corrections.

CORRESPONDENCE: National Trust for Historic Preservation – a thank you letter for renewing membership (contribution) and new cards.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Mark attended the June meeting and there was nothing to report. The Historical Commission is still waiting for a reply from the Board of Supervisors on Article X, the Atlas, and the Scope of Work on the Indiantown School House, and the \$500 donation to the Church of the Loving Shepherd in Beverly Bock's name.
